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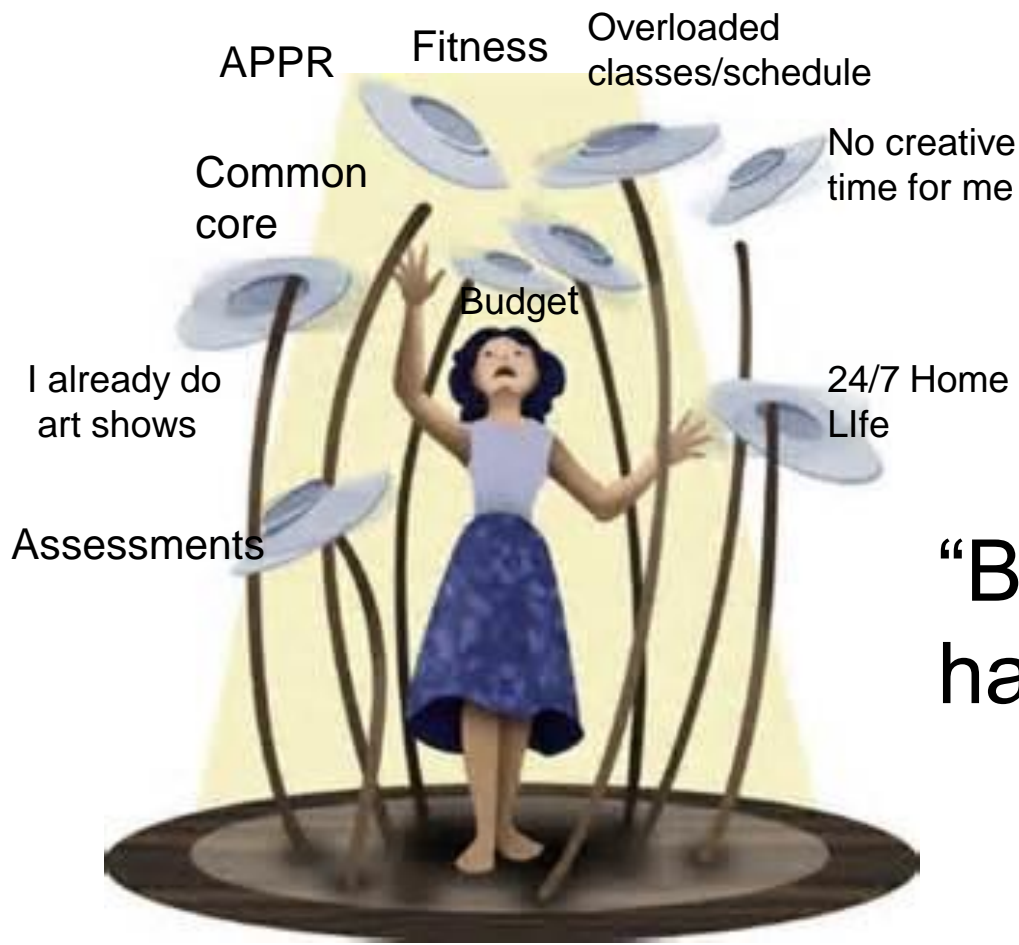

# What Is Youth Art Month?



- Youth Art Month (**YAM**) is an annual observance each March to emphasize the value of art and art education for all children and to encourage public support for quality school art programs.
- This observance is coordinated through the Art and Creative Materials Institute, a non profit organization of art and craft materials manufacturers.
- Established in 1961, YAM provides a forum for acknowledging skills that are not possible in other subjects.
- The Council for Art Education (CFAE), a sponsor of Youth Art Month, adopted the national theme, “Art Shapes The World!” It is endorsed by the National Art Education Association and co sponsored by AMACO/NASCO.
- Art education develops self- expression, appreciation the work of others, self – esteem, cooperation with others and critical thinking skills – all valuable to the success of our future leaders – ***our students!***

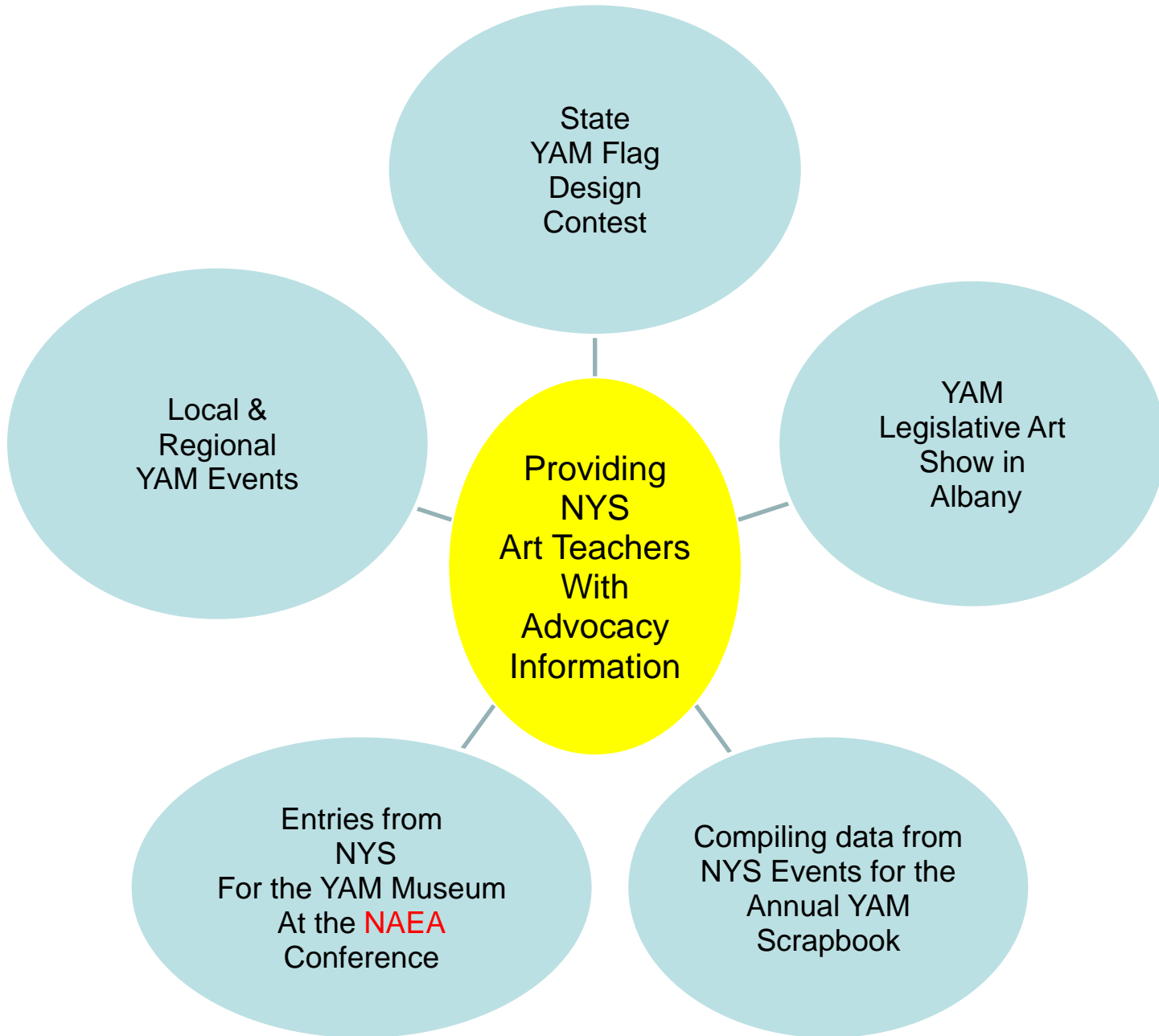

# 1. Flag Design



## Our New York State Flag Winner - 2015

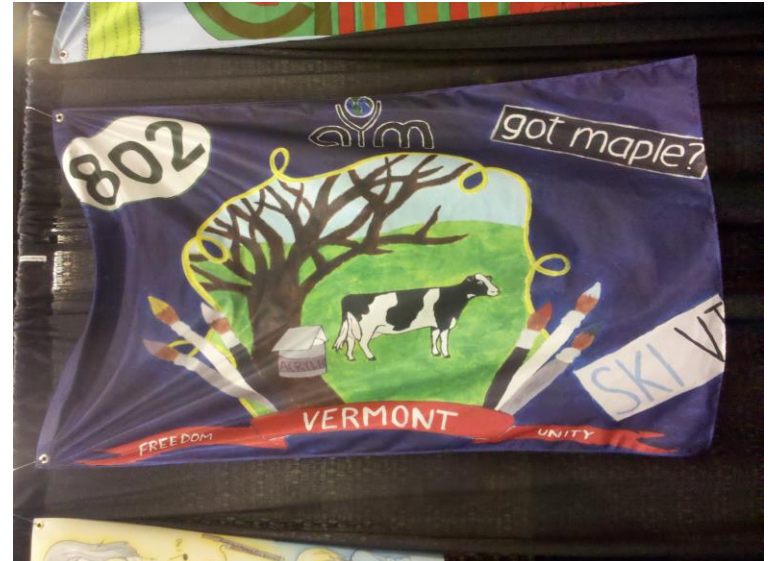
# National Flag Design Contest

To help promote YAM, the Council sponsors the event “School Flags Across The U.S. –Flying High”.

Winners are selected from each state and designs made into a 3 x 5 foot flag.

We also make a smaller flag for the student to keep.

Flags are shown at the NAEA convention in the Youth Art Month Museum, then returned to each state

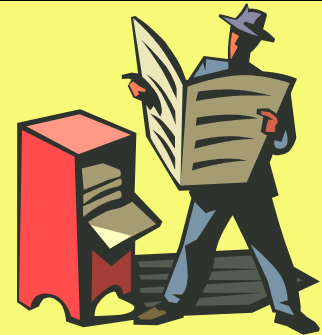

- **Use our YAM Bookmarks Lesson Plan and create visual reminders for distribution at your local library!**



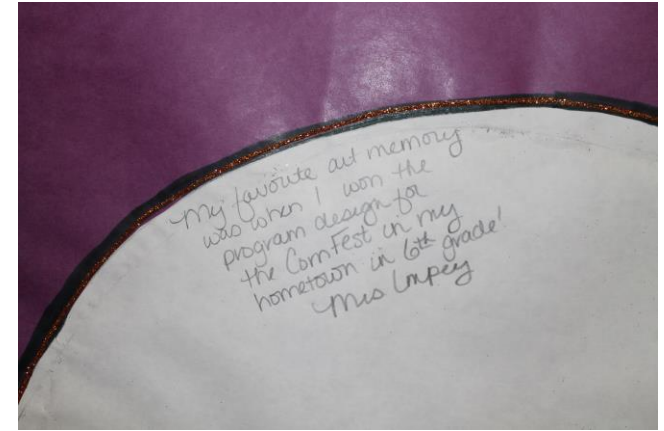
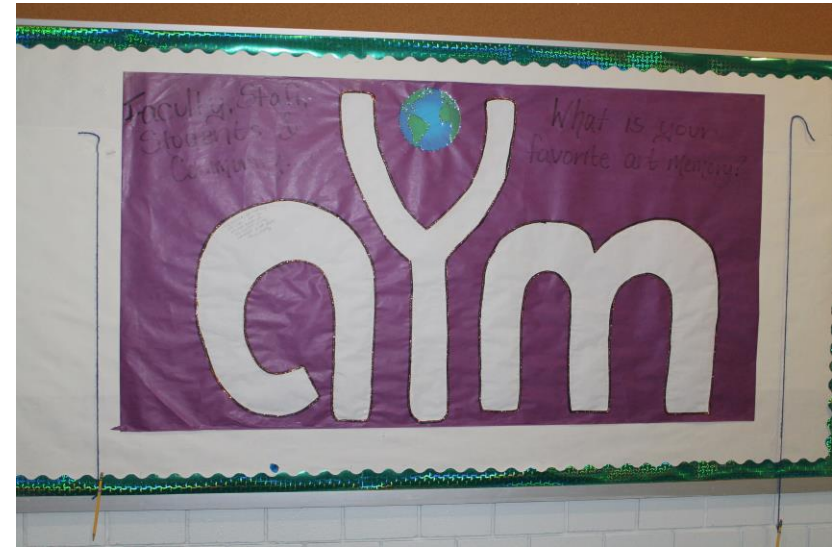

### Grades 4-5 Workshops:

#### DIY Printmaking: Kitchen Lithography

9:00-10:00, \$10  
 Printmaking: the DIY style. Learn the ins and outs of kitchen lithography: a cheap, easy, messy, and FUN way of creating unique and beautiful prints without the toxic, expensive chemicals. Find out how a bottle of Coca-Cola, vegetable oil, vinegar, and tin foil can make for the perfect art materials.



#### Chinese Ceramic Vessels

10:00 – 11:30, \$15  
 Porcelain has been used to create pottery since as early as 1600 B.C. and is still found all around us today! After learning about exciting new contemporary and traditional uses of porcelain in art history, we'll construct our own vase or vessel. With model magic clay we will practice how to work with and form the medium using different techniques and processes. The final product will then be painted and decorated with a pattern or scene inspired by those found on ancient Chinese pottery. This piece can be used functionally, serve as decoration, or could be a lovely gift.



#### Cartooning

11:30-1:00, \$15  
 Have you ever longed to doodle Poodles, People and Animals? You don't have to be a fantastic artist to draw cartoon characters. You imagination and creativity will guide you in this step-by-step Cartoon drawing class. A sense of humor is also great to have. In this Cartoon workshop you will learn basic character drawings, develop storyboards, and have a finished comic page when you leave the class.



### Grades 6-8 Workshops:

#### Concentric Kirigami Sculpture

9-10:30, \$15  
 A relief sculpture assembled with cut paper rings. Kirigami is a variation on the Japanese origami. Colorful cut paper designs are created when folds are made and portions are cut away. The end results is a design of repetition and intricacy that is easily created to make this paper sculpture.



#### Make a Fake Cake

10:30-11:30, \$10  
 Pop art sculpture cupcakes. Students will prepare their own visual delight cupcake. The cupcake sculpture is a lasting treat that can be decorated with voluminous finger paints that spread like icing. Cupcakes can also be decorated with sequins, glitter, confetti, beads, etc.



#### The Most Magnificent Invention

11:30-1:00, \$15  
 Inspired by Ashley Spire's book *The Most Magnificent Thing*, we will be using our brain power to dream up and construct incredible inventions using repurposed materials. Exploring ideas about three dimensional forms in space and innovative artists like Alexander Calder, we will work together to create collaborative sculptures. Anything is possible with our imaginations and teamwork!



### Grades 9-12 workshops:

#### Figure Drawing Workshop

 Experiment with exciting drawing techniques from a live (clothed) model. The class will be focused on experimentation and the learning process, teaching students how to draw from what they see. Focus will not be on the product, but the process. Leave with an array of interesting drawings, a keener sense of sight, and a more open mind!
